March 31, 2019
Fourth Sunday of Lent

It is hard to admit how easily we get lost. We lose our way in the rush of tasks, meetings, and activities and get out of the habit of daily prayer, Sunday Mass, and service. We get caught up in the pursuit of material wealth, power, social status, and worldly success. We may be dismissive of people whose perspectives are different from our own. We become selfish and self-centered. We are blind to the needs of others, concerned solely with ourselves, our family, our small social circles. We get off track and for a while do not even realize we are lost. Like the young son in the parable, something has to happen to bring us back to our senses.



FOUND

The young son “hit bottom” and made his way home. The Israelites learned to trust in and follow God and entered the Promised Land. We are found the moment we realize we are lost and begin our journey back to the Lord. Jesus not only shows us the way, Christ is our way home to God. Our homeward path is often an examination of conscience, by which we search our hearts and recognize our failings. We may need to make amends to those whom we have hurt; we might be called to a change of attitude or behavior. Are you lost? Now is the perfect time to open your mind and heart, and admit that you have lost your way. Lent is a season when we admit the ways that we are missing the mark and return to God. Often, we do so through the sacrament of Reconciliation, in which we confess our sins, are given penance, and accept Christ’s warm embrace of forgiveness.

Cuarto Domingo de Cuaresma

Es difícil admitir lo fácil que es perdernos. Perdemos nuestro camino por las prisas de hacer el trabajo, las reuniones y las actividades y nos salimos del hábito de la oración diaria, la Misa dominical y el servicio. Quedamos atrapados en seguir la riqueza material, el poder, la posición social y el éxito mundano. Podemos ser despectivos con personas cuyas perspectivas son diferentes a las nuestras. Nos volvemos egoístas y egocéntricos. Estamos ciegos a las necesidades de los demás, preocupados solamente por nosotros, nuestras familias y nuestros pequeños círculos sociales. Nos desviamos del tema y a veces ni nos damos cuenta que estamos perdidos. Como el hijo joven de la parábola, algo ha pasado que nos vuelve a nuestros sentidos.

ENCONTRADO

El hijo joven “toco fondo” y emprende el camino de regreso a casa. Los israelitas aprendieron a confiar y seguir a Dios y entraron a la Tierra Prometida. Encontramos el momento y nos damos cuenta que estamos perdidos y empezamos nuestro camino de regreso hacia el Señor. Jesús no únicamente nos muestra el camino, Cristo es nuestro camino de regreso a la casa de Dios. Nuestra ruta de regreso a menudo es un examen de consciencia, por medio de la cual examinamos nuestros corazones y reconocemos nuestras fallas. Quizá necesitamos hacer algunas rectificaciones a quienes hemos herido; podríamos estar llamados a hacer un cambio de actitud o comportamiento. ¿Estás perdido? Ahora es el tiempo perfecto para abrir nuestra mente y corazón, y admitir que has perdido el camino. La Cuaresma es un tiempo cuando admitimos las formas que estamos perdiendo el objetivo y regresar a Dios. A menudo, lo hacemos por medio del Sacramento de la Reconciliación, en el cual confesamos nuestros pecados, recibimos una penitencia y aceptamos de Cristo su abrazo cálido del perdón.

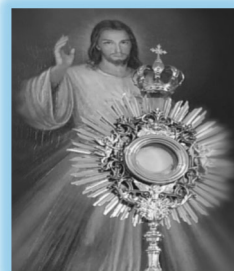

Dice un canto: *«Nos has sacado al desierto, Señor, de la libertad y está el corazón atento a la luz de tu Verdad. Subimos con esperanza la escalada cuaresmal, y el pueblo de Dios avanza hasta la cumbre pascual».* En estas líneas esta, excelentemente condensada, toda la espiritualidad del Tiempo de Cuaresma. Ésta no es otra cosa sino una peregrinación espiritual que iniciamos desde lo más profundo de nuestra alma penitente hacia el encuentro del Señor Resucitado.

La Cuaresma nos saca de la esclavitud del pecado, como a los israelitas de Egipto, y pretende llevarnos a la tierra de la libertad verdadera, la tierra prometida. Mediante las prácticas cuaresmales buscamos el desasirnos de todo lastre mundano de pecado, de incoherencia fe-vida, para caminar conforme a la Verdad que hemos conocido y que nos ha abordado en esta vida, a la espera de hacerse plena en la eternidad del cielo.

Iniciar la Cuaresma es, por tanto, un nuevo “kairós”, una nueva oportunidad para volver a Dios, del cual nos hemos podido separar con harta frecuencia dada la hostilidad con que este mundo trata nuestra fe cristiana y complica nuestro seguimiento decidido y acertado del Dios único y verdadero. Esta es nuestra esperanza cierta: tenerle a Él como garantía de vida y como estímulo constante y vital para continuar la escalada cuaresmal, para enfrentar las pruebas de este tiempo y no sucumbir a las asechanzas del enemigo.

Subamos, pues, e iniciemos esta peregrinación convencidos de la asistencia del Espíritu Santo y de la compañía de los ángeles, hasta que lleguemos la cumbre del monte pascual que es uno solo: Cristo el Señor, alfa y omega, principio y fin.

Oración de Cuaresma

Señor Jesús, con tu Cruz y Resurrección nos has hecho libres. Durante esta Cuaresma, dirígenos por tu Espíritu Santo a vivir más fielmente en la libertad cristiana.

Mediante la oración, aumento en caridad y las disciplinas de este tiempo sagrado, acércanos más a Ti. Purifica las intenciones de mi corazón para que todas mis prácticas cuaresmales sean para tu albanza y gloria.

Concede que por nuestras palabras y acciones, podamos ser mensajeros fieles del mensaje del Evangelio a un mundo necesitado de la esperanza de tu misericordia.

Nuestra Madre la Virgen, en muchas de sus apariciones, nos habla de ofrecer sacrificios voluntarios por la conversión de los pecadores. En Fátima le decía a Lucía: "Orad y haced sacrificios por los pecadores, porque van muchas almas al infierno, porque no hay quien se sacrifique ni ore por ellas" (13 de agosto de 1917).

The topic is:

The Sacrament of Confirmation

The theme for the Pope's message for Lent 2019 is 'For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God (Rm 8:19)'.

"It's an appeal to the faithful to not allow this season of grace to pass in vain, Pope Francis says that if, 'the Lent of the Son of God 'was an entry into the desert of creation to make it become again that garden of communion with God that it was before the original sin, Christians today are invited to embody the paschal mystery more deeply and concretely in their personal, family and social lives, above all by fasting, prayer and almsgiving.'

"Fasting, the Pope says, means turning away from the temptation to 'devour' everything to satisfy our voracity; Prayer teaches us to abandon idolatry and the self-sufficiency of our ego; Almsgiving or charity, whereby we escape from the insanity of hoarding everything for ourselves in the illusory belief that we can secure a future that does not belong to us.

"Pope Francis tells us that if we follow this journey it 'is possible to rediscover the joy of God's plan for creation and for each of us, which is to love him, our brothers and sisters, and the entire world, and to find in this love our true happiness.'

"The path to Easter, therefore, demands that 'we renew our faces and hearts as Christians through repentance, conversion, and forgiveness' the Pope said pointing out that it is a call that involves the whole of creation.

"I encourage the faithful to reflect during this Lenten season on how to grow closer to God by our daily actions, thoughts, words and to consider what sacrifice might be made to achieve this.
